ANNUAL MEETING IN MAY 2020

Public meetings are suspended until further notice.

Due to an unstable internet connection the meeting was truncated. The following items are produced for note:

The school is probably going to admit some pupils from June 1st but this is still open to national and local discussion

Should we purchase the sign which was discussed some time ago to go at the end of Manor footpath indicating the danger of traffic?

Mark and Karen Rees continue to work to improve the village environment. Their report follows: <u>BKV Wildflower Meadows</u>

1. We are now working with the gardener at the surgery, Sarah Black. She prepared a small bed for us at the top end of the staff car park and we were able to put some meadow seed in. We are now watering daily and hoping the seeds will provide a very small meadow for the summer months.

Sarah has said, if we're successfull she'll work with us to find a larger patch for next year.

Note: our first plot on the right as you drive into the surgery was strimmed despite us having communicated with the surgery team and their gardener last year. I fair, we won't see the yellow rattle coming up where we planted the seeds last autumn.

The wildflower meadow by the edge of the playing field next the Chris Martin's fence seems to be doing well.
 The meadow by the bench on Springs Hill also seems to be okay, we will keep tidying the area, strimming and cutting the brambles back. Mark also strimmed around the planters over the road so it all looks smart.

4. The bank at Newtown is very overgrown, so we'll just wait and see if any yellow rattle comes up. I think Dee strimmed around the planters so they look nice and tidy.

5. We put in a wildflower bed at the Crown & Anchor in front of the car park. We've been watering daily and hopefully we'll get a good display going.

All the above, except Newtown have a small sign to nudge passers by if they look closely enough.

6. The phone box on the High Street has an intermittent fault. We tried making a call on 14th May and there was no dial tone, we rang the box number to have the call fail on the first attempt but get through on the second attempt. Mark will report this to BT. The door also sticks terrible, so not sure if they might want to help fix the door as well? Otherwise we'll need to get some sandpaper to it and see what we can do.

Both boxes have rainbows on the top windows.7. Thinking of the memorial hall now. We will await a plumber putting a pipe in place at the back of the public conveniences so we can hook up to water.

Plans for next month:-

1. Water and look after the meadows, keep the areas tidy.

Of Note:-

The bench at the bottom end of Back Lane looks brilliant! We have seen folks sat on it watching the world go by. The poppies at the War Memorial look splendid and have been the subject matter of many photographs on social media.

Midway Stores are now managing their waste in a responsible way.

The pots in the square and outside the hall have provided a wonderful display of colour over the winter months. The time taken to plan and then plant them up does our village proud.
